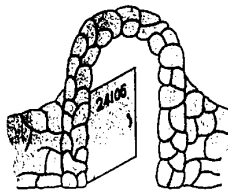

Sign-Up Begins For Driver Ed

FARMINGTON Registration for summer driver education will take place the week of May 25 to 29 in all junior and senior high schools of Farmington.

Application blanks will also be available in the main offices of Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Mercy High Schools.

FOR THOSE not attending Farmington schools but residing within the district, registration may be made at the driver education office in the administration building, 32500 Shiawassee, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. until May 29.

Any student residing in the Farmington school district who will be 16 by Dec. 31, 1970, may register. All students, regardless of any previous registrations, must complete a summers registration form to be considered for the summer program.

Assignment to classes is based primarily on age with older students being granted priority. Every effort will be made to give students their choice of sessions.

FIRST SESSION begins June 15 and continues, Monday through Friday, until July 23. Second session will be held Monday through Saturday, July 20 to Aug. 21.

In order to meet state requirements, students must attend all classes during the session.

There are no course fees for residents of the school district. At the initial class session, students should have their birth certificate and \$2.10 for a textbook.
