

C'ville To Revise Activities Rules

Following a two-day weekend retreat in which all school policies were discussed in detail, a four-man group has been named to establish a new set of guide lines to govern all club and other extra-curricular activities at Clarenceville High School.

Headed by David McDowell, superintendent of schools, the group also includes Dr. Martin Wechsler, Robert Erickson and Raymond Chaiken, members of the Board of Education.

"EACH OF us is going to write a set of guidelines as we think they should be written," Supl. McDowell explained.

"Then the four of us will sit down and take the best parts of each and combine them into the policy."

McDowell stated that this course was suggested at the retreat last weekend at Walden Woods, in order that there

could be no mistaken ideas and that the policy would stand up for some time.

"We worked from 7 p.m. Friday evening until midnight and from 9 Saturday morning until 1:30 in the afternoon," McDowell said, "and made a complete study of all of our policies and suggested some changes, on which the board will act later."

Among the many ideas discussed, most of the time was spent on the policy regarding extra-curricular activities, including student clubs and the improvement of the role of the student council in school affairs.

"WE ARE striving to have the same policy in effect for all activities whether they are during the school day or extra-curricular work," McDowell explained.

"We are going to strive to be fair with all groups, and it

was this study that made our retreat so productive."

According to McDowell, 14 members of the administration staff and the Board of Education attended the session.

Police Aid Pact Meeting Is Set

In the hopes of establishing some leadership guidelines which would assist members of the Police Mutual Aid Agreement, Mayor Edward McNamara has called a meeting of pact members for next Thursday.

All pact members have been asked to attend. They are: Belleville, Dearborn, Dearborn Heights, Garden City, Inkster, Northville, Plymouth, Wayne and Westland (all cities); and the townships of Redford, Romulus, Sumpter, Van Buren, Canton, Northville and Plymouth.

ALTHOUGH Livonia has signed the Police Mutual Aid

Agreement, not all those in the area have complied.

McNamara said he would like to discuss mutual aid and to determine to what extent cities and townships would commit their resources.

"The recent problem in River Rouge dictates urgency for all communities to the pact to adopt that document," McNamara said.

"Further, it appears additional coordination is necessary in order to be sure we are prepared for future emergencies," he said.

The meeting will be held in the basement of the Livonia Police Station beginning at 9:30 a.m.
