Spreen suit threat puzzles board

Sheriff Johannes Spreen's latest clowup left Oakland County commis-loners scratching their heads with puz-

sioners scratching their heads with pur-siement.
"Off the wall." "Contradictory." "I don't understand where he's coming from," Republican majority commis-sioners said after Spreen's 10-minute speech to them Thursday. The Democratic sherilf told commis-sioners he would sue them over the jail crowding issue, accused them of de-atroying and demoralizing his depart-ment, and then offered to "work togeth-er" to solve the problem. Spreen told them, "I am asking my attorney to take legal action against you on my behalf."

ASKED BY a reporter what legal action would be taken and who was his attorney. Spreen replied it would be in U.S. District Court and that his attorney is Stephen Hitchcock.
The sherilf could not explain what legal action be was contemplating. He quickly departed to attend a funeral.
A call to Hitchcock's Southfield officer revealed Hitchcock is out of town until July 25.
In his prepared remarks. Spreen said, "Soon our doors of our Oakland County Jail will hurst open from overcrowding." He said neighboring counties had built new julif actilities.
And he noted that a jail study committee had "adopted my plan with one deletion," without mentioning the deletion, then issued his threat of legal action.

cerns of the Great Lakes by the Congress."


