Shuttle buses run 2 routes during fair

The Ann Arbor Transporation Authority again is running a shuttle bus system during the Ann Arbor Art Fair, which continues through Saturday.

This year, instead of just one route from Briarwood Mail to the Main Street Fair, there will be two routes.

Route One, called the Art Fair/Main Street, is the same as past shuttles, traveling from Briarwood to Pioneer High School to Main Street with the drop-off point at Main and William streets. Boute Two, called the Air Fair/State-S. University, also will leave from Briarwood, proceed down State Street to S. University, dropping people off at S. University and Tappan.
