Health group sponsors play

The playwright is John Kosik, ACSW, a social worker and mental-health professional. Kosik has worked with ex-mental patients in that neighborhood since 1979 and has written short stories about similar themes.

The Mental Health Performing Arts Association is a new organization dedicated to furthering the interests of mental health through the use of the performing arts.

Fourth Street tells plays for 4th season

The Fourth Street Playhouse's fourth season of premiere productions will include a subscription series of seven plays to be presented in its theater in downtown Royal Oak.

The 1983-84 season will open Friday, Sept. 23, with the Michigan premiere of "Child Byron" by Romulus Linney. The story of the life and poetry of Lord Byron will run through Saturday, Nov. 6.

The playhouse will present the world premiere of "Whitetail" by Michigan playwright Bill Sonnegga. The play about family relationships is set in the Michigan north woods during deer-hunting season.

The 1984 portion of the season begins with the Michigan premiere of "The Abduction" by Ruth Wolff (Jan. 6 to Feb. 10), a true love story involving the abdication of Queen Christina of Sweden in 1685.

THE SEASON continues with "Waiting for the Parade" by John Murrell (Feb. 24 to April 7), about Canadian

women keeping the home fires burning during World War II; the Michigan premiere of "Still Life" by Emily Mann (April 13 to May 20), a tale about a Vietnam vet, his wife and his mistress, and a production to be announced (June 1 to July 14).

Fourth Street Playhouse's season concludes with the Michigan premiere of "Isn't It Romantic" by Wendy Wasserstein (July 20 to Sept. 1), a new play by the author of "Uncommon Women and Others."

The playhouse also will present a full season of Midnight Studio productions and will continue the new Readers' Theatre program, which stages readings of new plays.

Shuttle buses run 2 routes during fair

The Ann Arbor Transportation Authority again is running a shuttle bus system during the Ann Arbor Art Fair, which continues through Saturday.

This year, instead of just one route from Briarwood Mall to the Main Street Fair, there will be two routes.

Route One, called the Art Fair/Main Street, is the same as past shuttles, traveling from Briarwood to Pioneer High School to Main Street with the drop-off point at Main and William streets.

Route Two, called the Air Fair/State-S. University, also will leave from Briarwood, proceed down State Street to S. University, dropping people off at S. University and Tappan.

BOTH BUSES alternate routes. For example, when the Main Street bus returns to Briarwood after completing its route, it will become a State Street bus and vice versa. This will allow people to return to their automobiles by boarding any art-fair bus.

Hours of operation for the shuttles are 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. through Friday and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday. An information booth is set up at Briarwood Mall's parking lot — its location is the southeast corner just off the Sears loading dock.
