St. Mary awards bachelor degrees

St. Mary's College, Orchard Lake, is offering two new degree programs this fall.

Aimed at students who have completed some work at junior or community colleges, the programs lead to four-year degrees in bachelor of general studies or bachelor of human services.

To earn a degree in general studies, students must complete at least 15 semester hours in four areas: humanities, such as art, dance, English or communication arts; natural sciences, including biology, chemistry, mathematics or computer science; social sciences, such as psychology, sociology or economics; and personal values, including foreign

language or culture, theology or philosophy.

The human services program was designed for students who hold an associate degree in health, technical, business or social science fields. Supplemental work includes classes in education, management, behavioral sciences and liberal arts.

BOTH DEGREES require completion of 120 semester hours (at least 30 earned at St. Mary's) with a grade point average of 2.0 or better. A minimum of 30 semester hours must be earned in upper-level classes at the 300 and 400 levels.

Prospective students should submit official transcripts from all colleges, universities or professional training programs to the St. Mary's admissions office. The documents will be used by advisers or program directors to help

students plan a degree program. Registration for the fall semester will take place on Wednesday, Aug. 31. Classes begin Thursday, Sept. 1. For more information, call Doug Elkins at St. Mary's College, 682-1885.
