## Suburbs ponder: Deal with Detroit or lawsuit?

EGELAND, WHO has guided super sewer plans for more than a decade, and two weeks of study have shown that splitting super sewer in Van Buren would result in higher costs for the southern communities.

Egeland met with representatives of the 14 suburbs, gathered as a Rate Review Committee, Tuesday morning.

DNR cited claims by Detroit that it some of the norther suburbs were legally obligated to send their sewage into the Detroit system by way of two Rouge valley interceptors.

DNR has also been under political heat from outstate Michigan communities who want federal aid for their projects and don't want to see the Huron Valley project soaking up more than \$420 million in aid.

1984. After that, the federal govern-ment is reducing its share to 50 per-cent.

Egeland quoted DNR and Detroit of-icials as saying they could avoid over-loading the Rouge system and polluting loading the Rouge system and polluting to river by a combination of new con-struction and better management prac-tices.


