# Collectors Set For Show

If you have an avid interest in stamp collecting, or just a sneaking one, if you'd like to see between a quarter and a half a million dollars worth of stamps in one building; if you like to brush up on your knowledge of history and geography, then...

Plymouth High School is a good place to visit this weekend. The West Suburban Stamp Club is all set for its first exhibition and bourse, Saturday and Sunday, May 16 and 17. The show will open at 10 a.m. and close at 9 p.m., Saturday. Sunday the hours will be from 1 to 7 p.m.

Admission and parking at the high school, located at Church and Main, are free.

Camps of Plymouth. Three-quarters of the family is involved in the project.

Fourteen-year-old Mike is entering his topical collection of ships with first-day covers. He will enter 12 of his album pages, showing ships of interest, Saturday morning the pages, mounted on cardboard, six to a sheet, will be put into frames, ready for the contest and exhibition.

Mike's entry is appropriate since the stamp show theme is "Mayflower 350," commemorating the 350th anniversary of the sailing of the Mayflower. Not only does Mike have to choose the stamps which he considers most interesting and most liked, but he must illustrate the sheets and write accounts of their historical interest and importance.

Camp is entering his collection of first-day covers of the flight of the Graf Zeppelin in 1929. His covers illustrate that while much was made of Lindbergh's flight across the Atlantic, the Zeppelin flew around the world with only three stops only a year later.

According to both father and son, stamp collecting is an interesting way to study history and geography. Mrs. Camp, the third member of the family interested in collecting, has a topical collection of flowers, reflecting her interest in gardens and garden clubs. Before moving to Plymouth last December, they belonged to

the Midwest Philatelic Association in Kansas City. The only hobby in the family is daughter Barbara, a ninth-grader who likes to cook instead of collect.

At the show, philatelists and friends will not only be able to view the Camps' exhibits and those like them, but they will be able to come away with souvenirs of the event. Very attractive commemorative covers are being sold for \$1 a set. The envelopes are printed with a picture of the Mayflower, and may be canceled at a U.S. Post Office substitution set up for both days of the show. The Post Office will also have an exhibit.

The United Nations is sending an exhibit and sales agency, and there will be guest displays of 1920 Mayflower First Day Covers and of First Cancellations from Canada.

Twenty-three dealers from Illinois, Minnesota, Ohio, Michigan and Canada will be on hand to sell and buy stamps. However, club president, Richard Chellevoid, suggests that if you find some stamps in the attic you would like to have evaluated, you attend the next regular meeting of the stamp club, at 7:30 p.m., Thursday, May 21, in the Plymouth Community Credit Union, 300 S. Harvey. A dealer from Detroit will be there to take a more leisurely look at stamps for sale than will be possible at the show.
