Bracken Plays Key SAC Role

FARMINGTON

Air Force Tech Sgt. Edward E. Bracken is a crew chief with the first Strategic Air Command (SAC) unit to receive the new FB-11A strategic bomber.

A 1942 graduate of Farmington High School and veteran of World War II, Bracken is playing a key role in the Air Force's program of adding the versatile bomber to its inventory.

The 340th Bomb Group, Carswell AFB, Texas, provides maintenance and combat training for support personnel and the aircrews who will fly the dual seat supersonic aircraft when it becomes a part of the SAC deterrent force.

FEA, School District Enter Binding Mediation

FARMINGTON

The Farmington Education Association has submitted a dispute with the Farmington Board of Education to an arbitrator.

Binding arbitration of grievances between the teachers' bargaining unit and the board is a new feature of this year's contract between the two parties.

The first use of the provision concerns a dispute about the amount teachers should be paid for extra duties.

The grievance arose earlier this year when the FEA objected to junior high teachers working extra duty at rates varying from \$2 to \$4 per hour.

The Board of Education denied the grievance and said teachers should be paid at the \$8.25 rate only when the authority of the school is needed.

When someone other than a teacher can perform the task, the board said, a lesser rate can be charged. Duties paying less than \$5.25 per hour should be open to parents and other residents as well as teachers, the board's statement said.

ROGER ALLEN, FEA president, said Keith Groby, of the Labor and Industrial Relations department of Michigan State University, has been selected as the arbitrator.

A hearing has been scheduled for May 20 in the conference room in the central administration building at 3200 Shawwassee, Allen said.

Testimony will be taken from both sides, he said, and a decision will be made within two weeks of the hearing.

Although the original grievances concerned specific cases, Allen said the FEA would press its case concerning the overall issue of variations in pay rates.

The league has planned the meeting in an effort to help citizens become informed and has suggested that organizations want to send a representative to the meeting.
