Russian musician directs new school's program

A classical music school for children ages 6-14 will open at Lycee Interna-tional of Southfield on Monday, Sept. 19. Registration begins on Monday, Aug. 29.

Nikolai Lemberg, a graduate of the Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory of Music, is the director of the new pro-gram which will be similar to those provided by music conservatories throughout Europe for more than four centuries.

The music curriculum and certificate program includes opportunities for private study with outstanding faculty as well as performance and ensemble training. Required group classes in music theory, music literature and music history are offered to expand the scope of the student's musical education. The program requires three years of study culminating in a public recitial and examination.

Private instruction on a variety of instruments is offered for children at every age level including plano, violin, cello, percussion, flute, clarinet, bassoon, obee, trumpet, trombone, saxopinone and horn.

STUDENTS are also eligible to parti-clate in the children's choir. Instrumen-tal ensembles are open to students upon invitation of the faculty. In addition to Lemberg, other faculty members include: Alexander Resin, pi-

ano; Ina Nedoresova, violin; and Isabel-la Villenaky, piano. Russian emigre Lemberg, concert flutist, conductor/teacher, arrived in Detroit from Russia with his wife and children just six months ago.

In that period of time, the personable, talented musician has given several concerts and built a following of
students. His most recent accomplishment is the establishment of this

Lemberg has performed as solo and chamber musician throughout Europe.

He has won international compelitions for performance on flute in West Berlin and Havanna, Cuba.

He was principal flute with Moscow Radio and Television Symphonic Or-chestra and Moscow Opera Orcestra. Lemberg speaks English, German and Russian

The other faculty members also hold advanced degrees from prestigious European music propan music some conservatories.

Because Lemberg is concerned that his students hear fine music in class, Lemberg said, "Every teacher will be a performer. Our teachers will be demonstrating what to play and how to play. This is the first thing in teaching music."

HE RECALLED how the great flu-tist, Jean Pierre Rampal, always dem-onstrated for his students at the Paris Conservatory.

To further help accomplish this goal, Misha Rachlevsky, director of Renais-sance Concerts, is donating tickets for students for a series of concerts at Or-chestra Hail.

"Live performances are an important part of a child't musical education," said Lemberg.

Another scholarship donation, in the form of a flute, for student use, was given by Shaul-Ben-Meler, flutist and member of the Detroit Symphony Or-

member of the beautiful chestra.

Lemberg sald many of the musicians he performed with in Russia have opened music schools in various parts of the world — Brooklyn, N.Y., Australia and Israel.

Many, with excellent credentials, are still looking for jobs and several have contacted him, but he already has his

contacted him, but he already has his faculty.

He said of this this type of music curriculum, new in the United States, but well established in Europe, "We love this idea and we dream of expanding it to include older students."


