What that meant to the librarians

was that this summer's reading club was a large success for the youth, for the Bucket Brigade volunteers who helped with the program and for the local businessmen who donated prizes, gift certificates and food for the end-of-the-summer party.

In keeping with the summer reading

theme, for every two books read, the readers earned a guess on which key fit the treasure chest of prizes.

The library staff hosted 5,550 youth at North Farmington High School for the end-of-the-summer party.

Prizes came from Texas Instruments of Farmington Hills, Children's Book Shop in Southfield, Domino's Pizza of Farmington Hills, Elias Brothers Big Boy on Orchard Lake and 10 Mile Road, Gabe Shoes, Great Getaway, Joe's Hobby Center, Pixieland and Pets 'N' Particulars.

Preschoolers and kindergartners who were read to during the summer needed to complete 12 books to earn their certificates.

Other Keys to the Castle participants had to read and report on at least six books to qualify for the certificates.
