Scott Glinski is one of those few players.

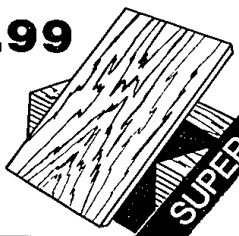

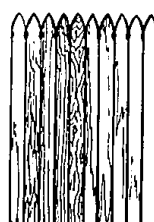

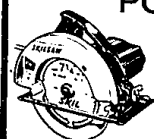
