Gear Slippage

The Gap & Its Culprits

Words are gears which turn the wheels of thought and acti-vate the communication shaft. When words are worn, gears slip. When words are abused, the language machine breaks let us consider briefly what our vice president means when he refers to "effete snobs." That is an abstract description requiring a little oiling if the message is to get across. MUCH OF THE inability of cople to understand each oth-

people to understand each oth-er. I believe, is due to using worn gears. The stippage at the word level results in a lan-guage breakdown making it difficult to communicate the message.

When concrete words are used the machine operates smoothly with little need for maintenance. Abstract work, however, often require oiling because their meaning depends upon interpretation by receiver as well as sender. The communication of nication gap exists today be-cause most of the words we use are abstract.

Abstract words become great targets for abuse. These gears become worn because the user does not understand their function or choosest of give them a job they are not equipped to handle.

THE COMMUNICATION gap exists also because words change in meaning with each generation. Many words have far different connotations today than their original meaning.

War, for instance, comes from the Old High German word "werra" meaning scandal, quarred or sedition. Radiardicalis' meaning having roots, but its political connotation today is quite the opposite.
