State Camps Are Busier

LANSING State forest campgrounds in northern Michigan managed by the Department of Natural Resources have never been as popular as in 1969.

They attracted a record turnout of more than 440,000 recreationists and sprung an estimated \$2.8 million in fun-time spending by these outdoor users.

Last year's upswing of campground users tops the previous high set in 1968.

LAST YEAR'S record-sized crowds at these state forest sites included more than 220,000 campers, whose outdoor stays stretched into 835,000 camper days for an other all-time high. Also figuring in the 1969 "greatness" were 220,000 non-campers who made use of picnic areas, fire circles, and other rustic facilities at these campgrounds.

CAMPGROUNDS in Houghton Lake State Forest

• Roscommon and Missaukee counties were again the most popular in northern Lower Michigan, as 104,000 camper days were recorded there.

Campgrounds in Au Sable State Forest in Crawford County showed more than 99,000 camper days to rank next highest on the region's list for top use.

In the Upper Peninsula, 62 state forest campgrounds drew 65,000 campers, 25% more than in 1968. Their outings amounted to 188,000 camper days. These same wilderness outposts also hosted 52,000 non-campers.

Most heavily-used state forest campgrounds above the Straits last year were those in Chippewa and Luce counties (Lake Superior State Forest) where 68,000 camper days were spent.

That region's sharpest increase in camper day use — totaling 50% — took place in campgrounds of Mackinac State Forest, Mackinac and Chippewa counties.
