- Take note of the fabric colors and styling styles in his wardrobe. Keep this information in mind while you shop.

- Silk can work best with the formal look of a suit, country sport coat or blazer. There are four basic patterns you should know: Stripes, polka dots, check and foulard.
- Stripes look well with tweed and plaid suits and blazers. When worn with a white shirt and business suit a striped tie will command attention.
- Polka dots work best with plaid suits and blazers and dress shirts.
- Cut the complement a sporty combination of a tweed jacket and an orange dress shirt. The term "club" refers to the repeating design of animals, boxers, etc. often seen on the English coat of arms to indicate the school or club to which a man belonged.
- Polyester is the name for rayon, acetate, cotton or silk fibers that are usually treated to create a comfortable, unstructured look for business suits designed for sport jackets and blazers.
- Knit ties require the casual look of a sport coat; they'll also add an air of informality to a business suit.
- Wool ties are for the rugged, no-frills look of tweed, corduroy and corduroy slacks.
- Try to select colors that will complement his hair as well as highlight eye, complexion or hair. There are many color blends available today that with a little experimentation you're sure to find the winning combination. The guide below, which has been prepared by Alfred Dunhill of London, lists which and just colors work best together.

Blue jacket: Red, dark blue, yellow or green tie.

Brown jacket: Dark brown, blue, tan or burgundy tie.

Gray jacket: Black, burgundy or blue tie.

Green jacket: Orange, green, beige, rust or burgundy tie.
