the group. Dr. Mervyn Ross was president of the incorporating officers.

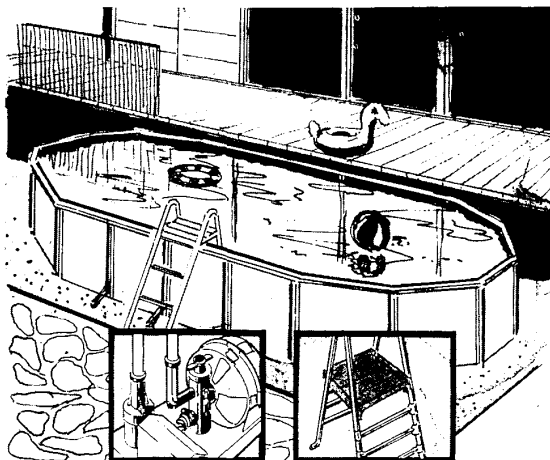

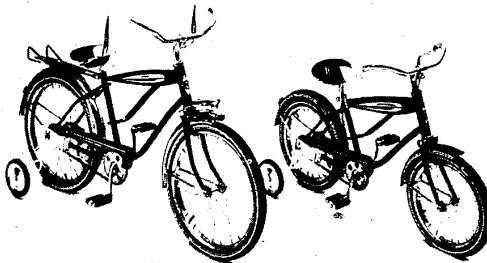

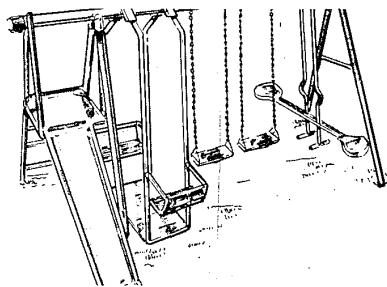
