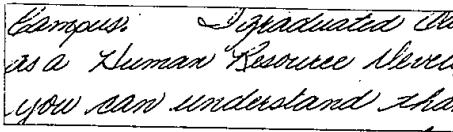
Dear Lorene:

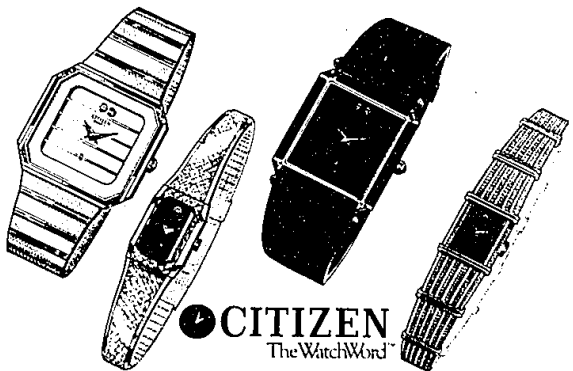
