Historical Scenes Part Of Outdoor Art Exhibit

Paintings of long-ago scenes in this area highlight a front-lawn art show in Livonia this weekend and next.

The show and sale is planned by Ralph Bulman, 9846 Newburgh, Livonia, between Ann Arbor Trail and Ann Arbor Rd.

He has invited members of the Livonia Artists Club and fellow students in several adult education art classes at Stevenson High School to join him in showing their works in front of his home June 5 to 7 and June 12 to 14.

"FROM NOON to dark, weather permitting," will be the hours of the show, Bulman said.

Included among Bulman's works will be several oil paintings of scenes in Plymouth and Livonia that go back half a century or more.

A life resident of this area, Bulman used old photographs and filled in from memory for the pictures that take one back in memory.

BULMAN DID his first painting in 1938, but gave up the hobby after son Ralph Jr. used one of his oils for a bit of finger painting.

After retiring from his trucking business, he returned to his canvases and has studied portrait painting as well as doing many landscapes, local scenes and still life studies.

Last year he put on a one-man show in the Nobel Library in Livonia.
