FEA Rates Candidates

FARMINGTON The Farmington Education Association has designated two incumbents as "preferred and qualified" candidates in Monday's school board election.

Besides the two candidates rated as "performed and qualified," Allen said three more candidates have been rated "qualified" and one rated "not recommended."

THE INCUMBENTS are two of eight candidates for three positions on the school board. Two four-year terms and one one-year term will be filled by the election.

ALLEN SAID the two other candidates, Mrs. Irene Rogalla, and Francis Milliken, were not rated because of insufficient information.

Milliken Tells Of Withdrawal

FARMINGTON F.J. Milliken, a candidate for a four-year seat on the Farmington Board of Education, has "withdrawn" from the campaign and asked his supporters to vote for two other candidates.

Officially, Milliken still is a candidate because the date for taking his name off the ballot has long since passed.

At that meeting, Milliken asked voters to support Ron Emmitt and Mrs. Kay Stirling for the four-year terms. He has not told this paper his preference for the one-year contest between John Washburn III, incumbent, and Mrs. Irene Rogalla.

"This decision not to seek election was announced on this paper June 3, five days before Monday's school election. The announcement was first made June 1 at the Flanders School PTA candidates night."

"I have felt that significant accomplishment has been seriously hindered by the lack of unanimity on important issues."

"In order to accomplish, you need joint effort, joint purpose and the ability to reach fruitful agreement."

"Now I find myself in the position of fractionalizing the elective vote by drawing votes away from other qualified candidates whose sympathies are similar to mine."

"I have, however, chosen to yield to two other candidates since I sincerely believe this is the most intelligent decision I can make in order to avoid splitting votes among too many candidates, thereby diluting what I am sure is the public wish."

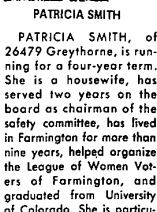
