FARMINGTON Farmington city councilmen are asking the Farmington Board of Education to contribute cash to help organize an area drug abuse committee.

BUT THE SCHOOL district has only expressed an interest in donating services and advisors and should also contribute cash, says Councilman John Allen.

Allen's sentiments were supported by other councilmen at the last meeting when the council appointed two members to represent the city on an area-wide drug abuse advisory committee.

The committee is now in the process of being formed and will consist of representatives from the city, township, school district, Jaycees, Youth Guidance Committee, YMCA,

courts, medical and religious associations.

FORMATION OF the committee is needed for the area to qualify for financial assistance from Oakland County through the county's drug abuse prevention program.

Gerard St. Souver, one of the speakers for the drug series sponsored by the Farmington Jaycee Auxiliary, recommended the Farmington Area have a general community advisory group of at least 20 members to act as policy-making body for any proposed drug prevention program.

"I'd like to see them contribute cash so we can proceed on an equal basis. If the township and city can afford it, so can the school district. It is the people's money involved, and this is a public program."

MAYOR Wilbur Brotherton said drug abuse is a community-wide problem which mostly concerns school-age children.

"I feel it is for the school board to step up to its responsibility and do more than provide facilities and administration," said Allen.

"I don't see how they can afford it, so we can proceed on an equal basis. If the township and city can afford it, so can the school district. It is the people's money involved, and this is a public program."

AFTER URGING the school board to contribute cash, the committee appointed two persons to represent the city on the drug abuse committee.

In addition, eight persons, who have been working with the Farmington Area Rap Line Program organized by the Rev. Ralph Rideout, will serve as members.

The eight are Donald J. Thompson, John R. Forbes, Norma Ringquist, Edward J. McDonnell, William S. Devlin, the Rev. John K. Hooper, the Rev. Donald J. Trent and Lawrence L. Whitten.

Another report scheduled to be presented to the board concerns the elementary report cards which were introduced last fall.

Instead of the traditional A, B and C ratings, teachers mark elementary students as "needs to improve, making progress or high achievement" in several areas.

Approved by the board of education on a year's trial basis, the card is a combination of check list and commentary. It is designed to be used in conjunction with parent-teacher conferences.

The card evolved as a result of almost two years of study by a parent-teacher committee and stemmed from hundreds of reporting methods used throughout the nation.

More than 80% of Farmington's professional staff prefer the new format.

The report card study will also be available in the administration building before the meeting.
