Corn Objects to Too Much Water

Soil Should Be Well Drained With Plenty of Humus or Plant Material.

This means, according to a recent bulletin issued by the New York College of Agriculture, that soil needs to be well drained, yet have plenty of moisture. An abundance for humus, or rotten plant material likewise, seenis an essential for successful in plowed-over soil individual where clover has being from. "Unless your soil tends to wash or run together, it is usually best to plow in the fail. There are several good reasons for this: First, there is plow in the fall. There are several pool reasons for this: Flirst, there is more time to spare; second, plowed land, unless very snotly, retains for the use of summer crops more of the water from winter rains and snows; third, organic material decays better if plowed under; this is especially important it sod land is used, as it commonly is for cora; fourth, insects are exposed to the winter weather and many perish; this also is especially important in the case of sod land, which is likely to inhere many injurious insects; fifth, most clay soils are made more losse and facility in the consideration of the preparation which you will need to make depends upon the kind of soil and the season. You must make your seed bed loose enough so that compact enough to retain ministure, and you must keep it free from weeds."
