

Summer's Spectacular Fruits Here

Here are the summer specialties.

Berries bursting with flavor, big beautiful Bing cherries, peaches so perfect they wear a modest blush, lusciously tart purple plums, sweet juicy Bartlett pears, clusters of cool grapes. These luscious fruits first meal planning into real midsummer gladness!

So very good eaten out of hand, or, in some cases, just lightly sugar and creamed, these fruits are quickly glamorized in dozens of different ways. Why not try the recipes and see for yourself?

Angel Berry Cake is a heavenly flavor-stretcher! Two cups of sweet red raspberries serve eight to 10 in little pink dream. It starts with an angel food cake from the bakery or one made from a mix.

ANGEL BERRY CAKE
1 10-inch angel cake
1 pt. fresh raspberries, crushed and sweetened with 1/2 cup sugar or one 10-ounce pkg. frozen raspberries, thawed.
2 c. whipping cream
1/4 c. sugar
1 t. vanilla
6 drops red food coloring

With sharp, thin-bladed knife, spin slices at 1-inch intervals around top of cake, between center and rim, cutting through cake from top to bottom. With knife, insert berries into slits. Spoon juice evenly over berries. Whip cream with sugar, vanilla, and food coloring. Frost entire cake. Refrigerate two to three hours. Makes eight to 10 servings.

FRESH FRUIT TARTS
10 baked tart shells, 3 1/2 inches in diameter
1 3 or 3 1/4 ounce package vanilla pudding mix
1/2 c. dairy sour cream
1 pt. fresh blueberries
1 c. whipping cream, whipped
1 pt. fresh strawberries
3 T. currant jelly, melted
4 peach halves
Red colored sugar

Prepare pudding according to package directions; cool slightly. Into 3/4 cup of the pudding; fold sour cream. Spoon this mixture into three tart shells and top with blueberries. Fold whipped cream into remaining pudding. Spoon into remaining tart shells. Dip strawberries into jelly; place atop three of the filled tarts. Sprinkle fresh peach halves with color keeper or pineapple juice to preserve color. Top remaining tarts with peaches, cut side down. Chill tarts till serving time. Sprinkle red sugar on peaches just before serving. Makes 10 tarts.

PLUM PARFATSIS
1 Pound purple plums
1 T. cornstarch
3/4 c. sugar
Dash of salt
Dash of cinnamon
Dash cloves
1 T. lemon juice
Vanilla ice cream

Wash plums. Slice, removing pits; measure three cups. Combine cornstarch, sugar, and salt in saucepan; stir in plums, spices, and lemon juice. Cover and bring to a boil. Simmer eight to 10 minutes; cool. Layer with vanilla ice cream in parfait glasses. Makes four to six servings.

GM Adopts New Type Odometer

In keeping with a trend among states to enact legislation with respect to odometer readings on passenger cars, General Motors has announced that a new one-way drive odometer system will be standard equipment on all 1969-model GM cars.

The new type odometer assembly will also be standard equipment on all 1969-model GM-built trucks except those equipped with "million-mile" odometers, which will receive them at a later date.

General Motors noted that laws applying to the turn-back of odometers already are in effect in Delaware, New Jersey, Kentucky and California and there are indications that similar measures may be considered by legislatures in other states next year.
