A career staff member of the Red Cross for 23 years, Miss Penhale has had two previous overseas tours of duty in the Far East Area of the Red Cross from February 1956 to December 1958, and in ARC's European Area from April of last year until her return last month to take the Vietnam assignment.

Miss Penhale joined the staff of the Red Cross in 1945 as a social worker in military

hospitals in the Midwest. Just before going to Japan in 1958, she was assistant director of Service in Military and Veterans Hospitals in Midwestern Area, with headquarters in St. Louis.

Between 1959 and 1967, she

was director of Service in Military and Veterans Hospitals in the Red Cross Western Area with headquarters in San Francisco. During this time, she served on several disaster relief operations, notably, that after the Alaska earthquake of Good Friday, 1964.
