

## Enrollment Sets Record At SC

Schoolcraft Community College enrollment jumped to an all-time high of 6,802 for the 1969-70 year with the registration of 528 for the spring session.

Actual numbers on campus this spring were 1,860 students, but some were taking fewer than the required number of courses to be counted as "full time," and the enrollment count is an equated number. In an equated basis, the 528 compares to 2,806 for winter semester, 2,182 for fall and 286 last summer.

A TOTAL of 105,435 semester hours of college work have been done by the students during the four periods, President Eric Bradner said. The spring enrollment was a 15.5% increase over the previous year, when an equated 497 students attended.

A breakdown of the 1,865

actual enrollment by residence, male-female, day-evening, vocational-technical and transfer program for the spring semester shows:

Resident students nearly double the number of non-residents, 1,190 to 675. But resident females (557) are present in larger proportion to resident males (433) than are non-resident females (233) to non-resident males (442).

Of the 1,075 total males and 790 total females, 871 are attending day classes, 868 night classes and 156 are taking both day and night classes. Vocational-technical programs enrolled 692 and transfer programs enrolled 118.

Education and business administration are the most popular elective curriculums. Liberal arts has the most numbers, but included are required courses.

(New York based government bond dealers); a research economist for the Federal Reserve Bank of New York; and an economic analyst for the U.S. Treasury Department, Washington, D.C.

## Aetna To Build \$120-Million 'City'

Plans for building a new \$120-million residential and commercial project in Avon Township, one of the largest developments of its kind ever undertaken in southeastern Michigan, has been announced by the Aetna Life Insurance Co.

This new community, to be known as Hampton Square, is being developed on a 740-acre tract of land formerly known as the Ferry-Morse Seed Farm, located on Rochester Rd. between the city of Troy and Rochester. Arrangements

for financing of the land acquisition and development were made by Detroit Mortgage and Realty Co. Hampton Square will be jointly developed by Aetna with Slavik Investors and Frankel Associates.

Plans include approximately 2,700 dwelling units of which 200 are single-family homes, 1,700 are apartments and 750 are townhouses. The total mix of residential dwelling units will provide housing for 6,000 new residents.


