# **Unexpected Reply** Nixon Writes ${\it Farmingtonian}$

invasion of Cambodia has received back a personal letter
of thanks.

James Blondin of 22728 Longacre in Farmington wrote the president April 30. Blondin's letter supported Nixon's move to destroy North Vietnamese and-Viet Cong camps in Cambodia.

The great personal sacrifice you and members of your family have made in the cause of freedom lends a particular significance to your views.

He was a resident of Westland and left a widow and one child.

Blondin said his brother be-lieved in the president's plan.

It's the quickest way to bring United States' troops home. Blondin said in his letter to President Nixon.

The Farmington man commented that an attack in Cambodia is "the way to get the boys home as soon as possible with the least casualities."

Blondin said removal of US troops is the goal of most citizens and that controversy over the war is really over the "strategy and tactics" of how this should be done.




