

STATE NEEDS MORE COW TEST WORKERS

Continuing rapid growth of cow testing associations in Michigan has brought about a shortage of trained testers, according to Prof. O. E. Reed, head of the dairy department at the Michigan Agricultural College.

With more than 100 associations active in the state, or 15 per cent of all those in the United States, the demand has exceeded the supply of men to handle the cow testing work in nearly a dozen new groups being held up temporarily waiting the assignment of testers.

Men with practical experience in dairy work, especially along feeding lines, frequently qualify for the association management positions. The dairy department at M. A. C. is said to be anxious to get in touch with men who are interested in this field of work.

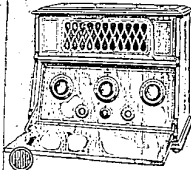

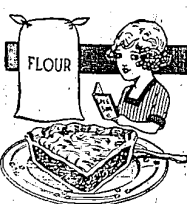
