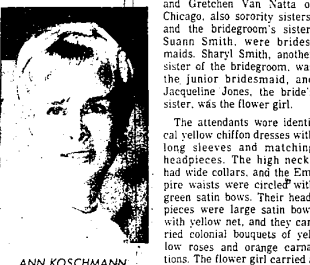

\$600 Awards Given For Conservation

Six scholarships worth \$600 each will go to youths winning a conservation contest sponsored by John Deere of Moline, Ill., and the cooperative extension service which supervises 4-H Club work.

The awards will be made during the National 4-H Congress in Chicago.

To be eligible, the young people must be between 14 and 19 years old and must have been 4-H Club members for at least three years.

THE CONTEST is part of a program entitled "You can Make the Difference," which urges young people to participate in conservation projects.

So far an estimated 300,000 boys and girls have enrolled in the program.

Medals of honor will be awarded for as many as four outstanding projects in each county, and there will be an expense-paid trip to the National 4-H Congress in Chicago.
