City Reports Maple Scale Infestation

The City of Farmington public services department reports a severe infestation of maple trees this year of the cottony maple scale. These white cottony masses can be prominently seen along the twigs and branches of maples, primarily. It may kill large branches and can weaken mature trees.

"Nothing can penetrate the scale insect's covering during the incubation period, but in a week or two the eggs will hatch and the young crawlers will be vulnerable to insecticides," said George H. Vandrak, director of public services.

The public services department has contracted with a tree specialist to spray all maple trees on city property and public right-of-ways. Residents of the city desiring trees sprayed on private property should call the public services department at 474-3599. There will be a nominal charge.

For those persons preferring to treat the infestation themselves, the recommended insecticide is Sevin.
