MINNEAPOLIS — An official proposal for a sweeping reorganization of the American Lutheran Church, based on an in-depth study begun in 1965, has been finalized for consideration by the church's legislative units.

The proposed overhaul of structure and operating procedure covers every level of activity from local parish to the operation of the national offices in Minneapolis.

Drafted by a six-man unit, known as the continuation long range study committee, the plan will be considered first by the ALC's Church Council late in June and finally by the church's biennial convention in San Antonio next October. Dr. Carl F. Beas, staff executive for the ALC's Commission on Research and Social Action, is chairman of the committee.

She was recently appointed to the post of assistant to the academic dean.

"Her qualifications, experience and background as former president of Madonna College will greatly enhance our college program," the Rev. Walter J. Ziembra, president, said.

"AS ASSISTANT to the dean, she is the first woman to be involved in the administrative structure of the Orchard Lake Schools and by virtue of her womanhood, will add a new flavor and dimension to the campus," he said.
