

Rocks too deep, hand Falcons 1st loss

Plymouth Salem's swim team handed Farmington its first loss of the season Thursday, dunking the Falcons 96-76 to stay in contention for the Western Lakes Activities Association title.

Farmington (5-1) lost for the first time despite taking first in seven of the 11 events.

"It was a tough meet," Salem coach Chuck Olson said. "They took quite a few firsts that made it kind of tense. We swam well as a team. They had some people out and just weren't deep enough."

Salem, which raised its league record to 3-0 (5-1 overall), showed its depth by taking enough seconds and thirds to offset Farmington's first place finishes.

Bob Bowler took top honors in the 50-yard freestyle (23.0) and was followed closely by teammate Scott Anderson (23.1).

Anderson also took a second in the 100 freestyle (50.2) behind teammate Erik Kleinsmith, who was victorious in 49.9.

Bowling, Kleinsmith and Anderson combined with Greg Wolf to win the 400 freestyle relay in a season's best time of 3:24.4.

Salem also finished second in the event with a team comprised of Rich Horvath, Bill Matthews, Chuck Eady and Jim Burns.

The Rocks' other individual winner was Wolf, who was clocked in 5:11.3 in capturing the 500-freeestyle. Teammate Jon Cain took second (5:16.3).

The Falcons were led by double winner Alec Campbell, who took first in the 200-freeestyle (1:50.0) and 100-butterfly (54.8).

Other individual winners for Farmington were Mike Wolford, 200-individual medley (2:14.9); Andy Burns, diving (179.23 points); Jay Weaver, 100 backstroke (1:01.3); and Eric Davis, 100-breaststroke (1:07.0).

Weaver, Davis, Wolford, Campbell teamed with Fred Courville to win the 100 medley relay in 1:45.5.

Salem also swam past Trenton Tuesday, behind double winners Kleinsmith

and Anderson. Kleinsmith captured both the 200 and 500-freestyle in 1:52.1 and 5:14.8, respectively, while Anderson was victorious in the 200-individual medley (2:16.0) and 100-freeestyle (51.1). Other Salem winners included: Bowling, 50-freeestyle (23.1); Wolf, 100-butterfly (1:02.9) and Dave Workman, 100-breaststroke (1:07.5).

Kleinsmith, Wolf, Anderson and Cain combined to win the 400-freeestyle relay in 3:24.4, while the team of Matthews, Mike Harwood, Workman and Bowler took the 200-medley relay in 1:51.5.

Salem meets Walled Lake Western Tuesday at home.

N. FARMINGTON 103, EDSEL FORD 69; The Raiders, ranked No. 10

on the state by the Michigan High School Coaches Association, swept to an easy victory over Dearborn Edsel Ford Tuesday to raise its season's dual meet record to 6-1.

Double winner Brian Goins paced North Farmington, taking first in the 100-freeestyle (49.9) and 100-backstroke (57.9).

He also teamed with Glen Spence, Chris Heintzman and Rob Lynch to win the 200-medley relay in 1:47.6.

Lynch won the 50-freeestyle in 23.5 and combined with Craig Burland, Mike Buatti and Mike Tunney to take the 400-freeestyle relay in 3:30.6.

Other individual winners for North Farmington were: Burland, 200-individual medley (2:16.9); Craig Arnold, diving (181.10); Spence, 100-butterfly

(1:01.3) and Scott Stinson, 100-breaststroke (1:09.0).

The Raiders also won big Tuesday, defeating Novi, 107-45 behind Goins' pool record in the 100-backstroke (56.7).

Goins also captured the 200-freeestyle (1:50.1) and anchored the winning 400-freeestyle relay team, combining with Dave Peterson, Tunney and Stinson (3:33.9).

Lynch also took two firsts, winning both the 50 and 100-freestyles in 23.5 and 51.8, respectively.

Other individual winners for North Farmington included: Burland, 200-individual medley (2:16.8); Arnold, diving (184.80 points); Tunney, 500 freestyle (3:06.2) and Stinson, 100-breaststroke (1:09.3).

Spence and Stinson teamed with Brian King and Bill Mulrooney to take top honors in the 200-medley relay with a clocking of 1:55.8.

North Farmington travels Tuesday to meet Redford Thursday and is home Thursday against Redford Union.

STEVENSON 105, CANTON 67; Dou-

ble winners Greg Deska and Jeff Albert paced the Spartans' easy win over Plymouth Canton Thursday.

Deska was victorious in the 200-individual medley (2:12.6) and 100-butterfly (59.2), while Albert captured both the 200 (1:56.7) and 500 (5:10.2) freestyles.

Both also had a hand in Stevenson's first place 400-freeestyle relay effort, combining with Dennis Word and Lewis Minstrell to win in 3:37.0.

Other individual Spartan winners were Kurt Hein, who won the 50-freeestyle in 23.1 and Word, who took first place in the 100-freeestyle (58.8).

Canton's individual winners included: Andy Flower, diving (184.10 points); Dean Roberts, 100-backstroke (1:03.9) and Joe McBratnie, 100-breaststroke (1:07.7).

Roberts and McBratnie teamed with Jim Lucco and Matt Krawak to win the 200 medley relay with a clocking of 1:50.8.

Stevenson improved its dual meet record to 5-1 with the victory. The Chiefs fell to 2-4.
