"We have a young party leadership. I'm 31, the youngest state chairman in the country," said Spencer Abraham, the Lansing lawyer and polister who has headed the Michigan GOP for the last year.
Although it hasn't been verified, Abraham and the young activists believe they are setting some kind of record for young faces in the crew of 77 delegates and 77 alternates.

"We've cneuraged the youth auxiliaries — the Young Republicans, the Teen Republicans and the College Republicans. And we don't want any young Person to think he or she can't be active in the senior party.


