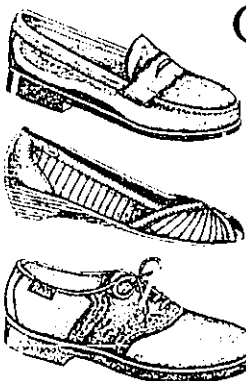


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Salute winter at Cranbrook 'Winterscape'

EDUCATIONAL LESSONS at the Cranbrook Institute of Science on how man and animals adapt to Arctic-like barometer readings are included in a program that includes a mustache and beard contest, a chocolate marshmallow solar energy roast, dog sledding demonstrations and a detailed lecture on what keeps penguins shuffling when everything else is freezing.

The events are part of Winterscape '84, a series of indoor and outdoor programs, demonstrations and participatory events focusing on winter at the Cranbrook Institute of Science, 500 Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills. Winterscape '84 began Jan. 21 and is being celebrated for four successive weekends.

Highlight of the festivities will be a towering ice castle (34 feet long and 14 feet high) surrounded by ice sculptures. The frozen fantasia comprises 150 blocks of ice, each weighing 400 pounds, amounting to 30 tons.

The upcoming weekend promises a number of events.

trails between 1-4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 4 and 5, according to Janet Johnson, curator of educational programs at the Institute of Science.

If Mother Nature agrees, the show will spotlight a litter of pups. Dillaway also will explain the art of dog sledding as well as describe how Eskimos and fur trappers made use of the transportation mode.

THE ATMOSPHERE in the Institute of Science auditorium is bound to get hairy at 4 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 4 and 5, during the mustache and beard contest.

Prizes will be awarded to the best in categories like, "fuzziest, grayest and longest," Johnson said. Men with beards or mustaches will be given free admission to the museum all weekend.

"It's a fun thing, but a long time ago that's how man really kept warm," Johnson said.

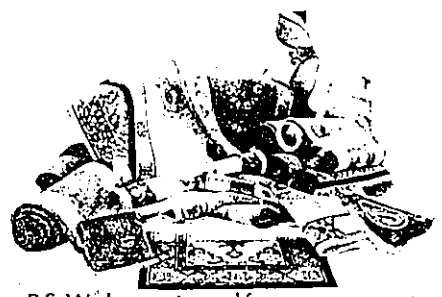
