Accounting tests give students a chance

The Detroit College of Business' fifth annual accounting test is slated for Saturday, Feb. 11, and more than 1,000 students are expected to participate.

The test, which gives high school students an opportunity to test their accounting skills, will be given at the

DCB Main Campus, 4801 Oakman Blvd., Dearborn, and at the extensions in Madison Heights and Flint. DCB in Flint has scheduled the test Feb. 18.

Presentations to the winners will be made by DCB representatives in the high school accounting classes. The stu-

dent winners will also be invited to the spring DCB awards banquet, where they will receive plaques.

The test is not designed to measure an aptitude for or an interest in an accounting career, or is it designed to compare the high school accounting programs represented at the testing.

Two tests will be given — a beginning test for those who have had less than a year of high school accounting and an advanced test for those having had a year or more.

In each test group at each location, the top three winners will receive cash

awards of \$100, \$75 and \$50. All students taking the test will receive participation certificates.

The tests will be given at 9 a.m., 11 a.m. and at 1 p.m. Students should pre-register for the tests with their accounting teachers. Students will be allowed to register at DCB on the day of the test only if all of the time periods are not filled.
