

Solomon shatters 4 marks in Hawk win

The Farmington Harrison gymnastics team set another team score record Wednesday night, pasting Clareville 131.1-122.6.

The 131.1 points is the highest team score earned by an Observant team this season, but even Harrison coach Kim Dennis admits, the judging was a bit relaxed.

"We performed well, don't get me wrong," she said. "But the scores were a bit high."

Dennis said she figured the Hawks score to be about 10 points too high, and the Clareville score nearly 20 points too high.

"It's nice for the girls to get high scores, but these were a bit unrealistic," she said.

"The trouble with the high scores is that when the kids go to the league meet, they might perform just as well and get a much lower score. They are

going to wonder what they did wrong. They just won't understand the inconsistency of the judges."

Freshman Tracey Solomon, unrealistic scoring or not, was fabulous. She shattered four Hawk records during the meet. Her 9.05 in the vault broke Andrea Birsas' old mark of 8.8 set in 1978. Solomon's 9.1 on floor exercise was the highest mark ever earned by a Hawk on any event.

Solomon's 8.5 on uneven parallel bars eclipsed her own record of 8.25. And her all-around score of 35.05 topped Kathy Purcell's 1979 record of 33.55 points.

Lauri Runk (8.15 on vault), Jill Birsas (8.35 on bars), and Solomon (8.4 on balance beam) all earned second place finishes for Harrison. Birsas' all-around score of 32.35 was also second.

Julie Runk scored an 8.6 on floor exercise which was good for a third. Jam-

le Lyons hit a 8.1 on beam, also third place.

The Hawks, ranked No. 2 in Observant, are 9-3 on the season. They travel to Walled Lake Central tonight.

NORTH FARMINGTON traveled to Hartland last Wednesday without two of their top performers, lost another at the first event, and lost the meet 129.3-126.05.

Lucine Toroyan was able to compete on only the bars because of a bad ankle. Eileen Murtaugh is still sidelined with the flu. Sharon Shifra injured her hand on her bars routine. Still, the Raiders

scored well.

"I was pleased, especially because we didn't have our whole team," said Raider coach Mary Johnsen-Giltz. "But I was really impressed with Hartland. They are a very fine team."

Senior Dona Kebrde and freshman Kara Karhu picked up the slack for the Raiders. Kebrde won the vault with an 8.25, and took thirds in both the beam (7.9) and floor exercise (8.35) tying teammate Lisa Brundie.

Karhu took second on bars (7.95) and beam (8.05). She also placed fourth on vault (7.9).

Shifra took third on vault with an

8.0 and Toroyan took third on bars with a 7.9.

The Raiders, the No. 1 team in Observant, are 10-3 on the year. They travel to Northville tonight.

FARMINGTON lost another heartbreaker, 111.5-111.05 Thursday night against Walled Lake Western.

The 111.05 was the highest team mark scored by the Falcons this season, but it wasn't enough.

Katie MacIntosh won three events for the Falcons. She scored an 8.3 on bars, 8.15 on beam and 8.1 on floor. Her 8.1 on vault was good for second place.

Karen Devine placed third on vault (7.8) and fourth on bars (7.3). Debi DeWitt took fourth on floor with a 7.1.

The Falcons (3-9) were ahead going into the final event. They are off until Wednesday, Feb. 29, when they travel to John Glenn.

"We played as well as we did Tuesday," said Harrison coach Mike Teachman, referring to Harrison's upset win over Plymouth Canton. "But the physical aspect took us out of the game."

The North Farmington swim team (ranked No. 2 in Observant) ended its Northwest Suburban League dual meet season with a 127-41 win against Garden City.

The Raiders coasted through the league with a perfect 5-0 record. The league meet will be Thursday and Friday, March 1-2, at Livonia Franklin.

Senior captain Tom Kerr and Glenn Spence each won two events for the Raiders.

Kerr captured the 200-yard individual

medley in 2:20.7 and the 100-breaststroke, 1:11.4.

Spence took the 100-butterfly (1:01.6) and the 100-backstroke (1:04.0).

North won both relays. The 200-yard medley team of Brian Golas, Chris Heintzman, Mike Turney and Rob Lynch won in 1:44.6.

The 400-freestyle team — Lynch, Craig Burland, Mike Buatti and Golas — qualified for the state meet, and broke a varsity and pool record with a 3:21.8.
