Wayne Rd. Bids Due July 15

A Westland project is among 27 in the state scheduled for bids by the Highway Department July 15.

Scheduled for completion in Nov., it will involve construction of grading and drainage structures and addition of a center lane for left turns at the intersection of Wayne Road and Palmer.

Work is to extend north and south on Wayne Road for 1.3 miles and includes paving, curb and gutter. Estimated cost is \$320,000. It will be one of the first two projects to receive 50% support of the federal government under a program to increase capacity and safety. The city of Westland will pay the balance.

2 Utility Stock, Bond Issues Ok'd

Sale of more than \$100 million in stocks and bonds by two of Michigan's major utility companies was approved recently by the Public Service Commission (PSC) of the Michigan Department of Commerce.

The PSC authorized Consumers Power Co. of Jackson to sell \$60 million in first mortgage bonds and 1,264,938 shares of \$10 par value common stock to finance part of its 1970 capital outlay program. The utility expects to spend an estimated \$239 million this year to improve and expand its facilities.

Michigan Consolidated Gas Co. of Detroit was authorized to issue \$30 million in first mortgage bonds to retire \$5.5 million in short-term notes and to finance part of its 1970 construction program.

Accountants Can Take IRS Exam

A special enrollment examination will be held on Sept. 28 and 29 in the Federal Building, Detroit, for accountants and others who wish to qualify to represent taxpayers at all levels before the Internal Revenue Service.

Tax practitioners who are not certified public accountants or attorneys must demonstrate their technical competence before they can be enrolled to represent clients before IRS. This right to practice is governed by technical and ethical standards set by the Treasury Department.

A sample of the special enrollment examination (Publication 695), information about the examination and application forms may be obtained by writing to the Internal Revenue Service, Taxpayer Service Section, Detroit, Mich. 48226.

Applicants must file no later than August 31 and must include with their application form a \$25 fee to cover the costs of administering the examination.
