Hilberry Plans Comedy Opener

The Detroit premiere of Peter Nichols' startling comedy that became a London and New York hit, will open the Hilberry Theatre Repertory Company's evening performance schedule Wednesday, July 15, at 8:30.

The following night, July 16 at 8:30, "2 by Pinter" opens for an eight-performance run in the newest studio production. It plays at 8:30 nightly except Sunday and Monday through July 25.

"JOE EGG," performed by Wayne State's company of graduate fellowship students, will be repeated Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 8:30. The following week it is joined by Robert Anderson's "You Know I Can't Hear You When the Water's Running," which opens July 22.

The company will then alternate in the two plays Wednesday through August 15. At matinees, they continue to present "The Land of the Dragon" for children, Wednesday through Fridays at 1:30. "Joe Egg" was first performed in Glasgow in 1967 as "An Day in the Death of Joe Egg." After a long run in London, "Joe Egg" opened in New York the following year, starring Albert Finney as Joe Egg's father.

It is a skilfully written play on an improbable subject — the life of a young couple with a detective child, the "Joe Egg" of the title. "For all that," the critic of the London Observer wrote, "it has to be described as a comedy, one of the funniest and most touching I've seen." Life Magazine called it "frank, tender, human, desperately funny."

THE HILBERRY cast is headed by Woody Eney of Richmond, Va., and Trina Cluff of San Diego, Calif., as the parents, Brian and Sheila.

Eney has been seen the past season as the dancing master in "The Bourgeois Gentleman," the porter in "Macbeth," Christian in "Cyrano de Bergerac," and the Archbishop in "The Unkinnest Gentleman." His highly praised performance in "Macbeth" was seen as Louise in "After the Fall," Nicole in "The Bourgeois Gentleman" and a witch in "Macbeth."

Robert Ronning of Everett, Wash., and Mary Benson of Charleston, W. Va., appear as the young couple, Freddy and Pam. Mary was in the first Hilberry Repertory Company in 1964, appearing under her maiden name, Mary Goldsmith. She is best remembered for her performance as Rosalind in "As You Like It." In the fall she will be joined in the acting company by her husband, Jon, whom she met as an army entertainment director in Korea.

Scott Stars In 'Patton'

The World War II generation was first and strongest in line to see the Observerland premiere screening of "Patton," a 20th Century-Fox release, which marked the opening of the fourth Quo Vadis Theatre in Westland.

Four star Gen. George S. Patton obviously impressed his public with his dashing escapades. Actor George C. Scott's portrayal of the blasphe-mous militarist is sure to impress moviegoers of all ages.

Scott takes on star quality in this fine historical report of Patton's career as a military commander, and he does it with a minimum of supporting cast. There's no leading lady whatsoever. Karl Malden as Gen. Omar C. Bradley, first Patton's aide and then his superior, is the only other sustained role.

FROM OPENING harangue in barracks language to concluding poignancy, Scott brings "Patton" with the nature of high echelon war making and the mystique of Americans at war to vivid life. He duels strafing aircraft with his ivory handled pistol: "Pearl handles are for whorehouse madams."

He glove whips a tender-year-old soldier with a case of battle nerves: "A coward shouldn't be in the same hospital with the battle-wounded."

He upstages Field Marshal Montgomery's political play: "I'll admit I'm a prima donna. What bothers me is that Montgomery won't admit he's one too."
