

Bar faces council scrutiny

Bootlegger's Restaurant — faced with the threat of liquor license revocation — will be the topic of a public hearing at 7 tonight in Farmington City Council chambers.

After approximately 100 police-re-

lated incidents in one year at the Grand River restaurant, the Farmington City Council Feb. 6 scheduled the hearing to receive public input and to allow Boot-

legger's owner, Joe Asclone, an opportunity to defend himself against charges of misconduct.

Among the complaints lodged against the restaurant are alleged incidents of fistfights, urinating in the parking lot, trespassing, patrons shout-

ing obscenities, squealing tires and honking horns.

But Asclone said Friday he most likely would not attend the public hearing, deferring to his attorney, Norman Farhat, of Southfield. Farhat was unavailable for comment.

"A review of the data clearly shows that over 50 percent of all incidents (involving Class C establishments in Farmington) requiring police attention involved the operation of Bootlegger's Bar," City Manager Robert Deadman told council Feb. 6.

Parking has been a major problem near the bar. Asclone has been plagued by complaints from area residents and some patrons.

Adding to the parking confrontation were incidents involving entertainment sponsored by the bar — wet T-shirt contests, banana eating contests and lingerie competitions.

Council's decision must be given to the Liquor Control Commission 30 days prior to expiration of the license in April. A council recommendation will be filed by March 30.

lome" from the opera "Hansel and Gretel." Also Beethoven's "Sinfonia No. 5 C" and Schubert's Symphony No. 8 in B Minor will be performed.

Tickets for main floor and balcony are \$6; for the loge, \$8; and for box seats, \$10. Tickets are available by calling Orchestra Hall's box office at 633-3700, 11:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Symphony members represent 40 communities in the tri-county area.
