

# Laker free throws end Hawk drive

The state basketball tournament means pressure. Teams that handle it well win. Those that don't head to the sidelines early.

West Bloomfield was unaffected by the pressure of its district opener with Farmington Harrison Tuesday. The Lakers cannot 10 straight free throws in the final quarter to overtake the Hawks and claim a 57-53 victory at Southfield.

West Bloomfield, now 8-13, meets the Southfield-North Farmington winner at 7 p.m. Friday for the Southfield district championship.

"We've really been a horrendous free throw shooting team all season," said West Bloomfield coach Frank Pileas. "We hit about 52 percent for the year, so it was a big plus for us tonight."

Indeed it was. The Lakers hit 23 of 26 for the game, with Todd Krumm pumping in 12 straight, including two with 11 seconds left that put West Bloomfield up by four and clinched the victory.

KRUMM KILLED the Hawks all night. He finished with 20 points and 11

much-needed rebounds. What made Krumm's performance so vital was the foul trouble the Lakers got into early. Three starters were tagged with three fouls apiece in the first half and starting center Alex Nalovich fouled out with 1:30 to go in the third quarter.

"He's our best athlete," Pileas said of Krumm. "You could see what type of athlete he is by the way he took charge in the second quarter when they went into a man-to-man (defense)."

Krumm poured in 10 second-quarter points, including six free throws, to help the Lakers leap to a 34-29 half-time lead. Seven Harrison turnovers aided the surge.

But the third quarter belonged to the Hawks. They got their running game in gear and grabbed a 42-40 lead when John Miller banked in a layup, drew Nalovich's fifth foul and put in the free throw.

HARRISON UPPED its two-point

advantage after three quarters to five early in the fourth on another Miller free throw and a Vince Enright basket. But West Bloomfield scored 12 of the next 14 points, with David Swain and Brett Power each contributing four, to put the Lakers in command 53-48.

"We didn't put the ball in the hole in clutch situations," said Harrison coach Mike Teachman, whose team finished 6-14. "We wanted to run the whole game. We didn't in the first half and that hurt us, but we got it going in the third and had a good quarter."

"Then we started trying what I call the 'home run pass' in the fourth quarter instead of working together."

The result was turnovers and poor shot selection. The Hawks committed 17 mistakes for the game to 12 for the Lakers. And Harrison, which hit 15 of its first 19 free throws, managed just two of five in the last quarter.

Joining Krumm in double figures in scoring for West Bloomfield was Robin

Asher with 12 points. Power had eight. Ron Karbowski came off the bench to pump in 14 points for Harrison. Enright tossed in 12, Miller had nine and Dave Quarles and Dave Younger had eight apiece.

Honoring the honorable...

Oakland University landed a pair of players on the All-Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) basketball teams, selected Sunday by coaches at the GLIAC spring meetings at Northwood Institute.

Brenda McLean, a junior, earned her third straight selection to the women's team. The 6-foot McLean was selected the past two years as a center. First-year OU coach Sue Kruszewski switched her to power forward this season.

The move didn't hurt McLean much. She averaged 15 points and 10.3 rebounds per GLIAC contest, connecting on 52 percent of her floor shots and nearly 80 percent of her free throws. McLean was second in Wayne State's Lori Janusiewicz (11.3) in rebounding in the conference.

Selected to the 10-player All-GLIAC men's squad was 6-7 senior forward Mike Mohn. Mohn was the circuit's second-leading scorer (19.3 points per game) behind Saginaw Valley's Marty Harmon (20.1). Mohn, who was also selected a year ago, led OU in rebounding as well with an 8.1 average.

Mohn leaves OU with several outstanding records, including second (to OU Hall of Honor charter member Carvin Melson) on the all-time scoring list with 1,589 career points (14.6 average). Perhaps his greatest attribute was his durability. He started every OU game during his four-year stint, 108 straight.

Mohn finished second in the conference voting for Most Valuable Player. Hillsdale's Dave Springer reaped that award.

For the women, Aya Williams, Kim Nash and Maria Reynolds were honorable mention All-GLIAC. Reynolds, a freshman, was also chosen to the league's All-Defensive first team.

OU's men lost their final six games and ended the season at 13-14. The women were 15-11 overall.

DAVID HOWARD, a 6-1 sophomore guard for Orchard Lake St. Mary, earned NAIA Player of the Week honors for Feb. 22-March 2. Howard poured in 22 points in a win over University of Michigan-Dearborn and added 29 in a clutch victory over Aquinas College. OLSM's victory over Aquinas clinched a NAIA District 23 playoff berth.

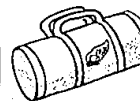
Howard, from Daytona Beach, Fla., was also chosen to the All-District 23 basketball team.

A PAIR OF LOCAL distance runners traveled quite a distance to make a name for themselves in collegiate sports. Doug Tolson and David Krafaur enrolled at University of Tennessee and helped it to a first-place finish at the Southeastern Conference Indoor Track and Field meet Feb. 25-26 at Louisiana State in Baton Rouge, La.

Tolson, from Westland, nipped teammate Phil Bedford in the three-mile run to finish first. Bedford was clocked at 13:42.92, Bedford at 13:42.93. Bedford had the race won but waited for Tolson, as the pair crossed the finish line together.

Krafaur, from Southfield, placed fourth in the two-mile run (9:02.85).

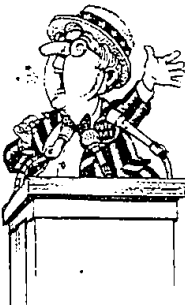
