Emo-tional: fallure to provide warmth, at-tention, supervision and normal living experiences. Verbai: excessive yelling, belittling and teasing. Sexual: incest and other indecent activity in the fami-ly.

Children who are beaten or showing other indications of cruel treatment, abandoned by their caretaker, poorly clothed, ill-fed and dirty are also con-

unattended much of the time, especially at night.

More signs are children who are kept at home from school for reasons other than illness, who are sexually abused or molested and who aren't given adequate shelter or sanitation.

"There's no sense in a child being immersed in boiling water, beaten with a bott or a baseball bat," Murphy said.

"This is supposed to be a civilized society."

The DSS has a telephone number that is equipped to take calls on suspected child abuse or neglect 24 hours a day. That number is 858-1590.


There's a "fine line" between disci-pline and where "child abuse kicks-in," Lee said.
