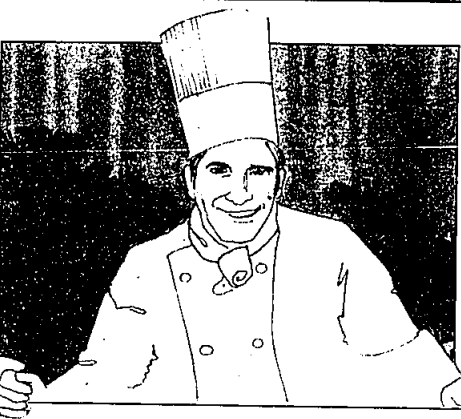
Couple mark anniversary
