Farmington Hills planning commis-sioners will consider changing the city's height restrictions for antenna towers at 7:30 p.m. tonight.

Some of Farmington Hills' subdivi-sion associations have promised to at-tend the public hearing to voice their opposition to a push from local radio operators seeking to have the city's zoning ordinance amended. If the zoning ordinance is amended,

radio operators will be able to build an antenna to a maximum of 75 feet. Cur-rently, ham operator towers are re-stricted to 25 feet.

When 24 local radio operators pre-sented a petition requesting the ord-nance change, city council members in January voted 4-2 to refer the request, without recommendation, to the plan-ning commission.

In the last few years, however, the Zoning Board of Appeals has granted at least seven variances to erect antennas tailer than 25 feet.

But radio operators contend that even though variances have been granted, "there exists no uniformly ap-

plied standard by which applications for variances are judged." Subdivision residents, on the other hand, prefer allowing the ZBA to grant variances rather than changing the or-

dinance.

Changing the ordinance, they claim, would allow radio operators to put up antennas without benefit of neighbor's input. Before a variance is granted, neighbors are asked for their comments.
