

Teach Michigan, educators urged

The Historical Society of Michigan and Hillsdale Educational Publishers jointly announced the second annual award for excellence in teaching Michigan history — the Ferris Lewis Award.

"The purpose of this award," according to Dave McConnell of Hillsdale Educational Publishers, "is to encourage teachers to teach Michigan history, thereby fostering in students a continued interest in the state and its history throughout their lives."

The award program recognizes those teachers who exhibit thoroughness, imagination, creativity and good rapport with their students in the process of teaching Michigan history.

The award will be presented during Michigan Week in May. The winner will receive a plaque and the opportunity to receive a cash prize directly or to donate it to his/her school library. In addition, a traveling trophy will be held for one year at the school of the winner.

This year's contest will spotlight teachers in grades 7-12; the 1985 award will honor a teacher from grades 1-6. Ferris E. Lewis (1901-1981), was an educator and a prolific author of Michigan history and state government textbooks. He had a long and distinguished career in teaching and administration which culminated in the chairmanship of the Social Science Department at Henry Ford Community College.

Nominations will be accepted from administrators, parents, students, teachers and interested individuals. Eligibility for the award is limited to teachers who present at least a one-semester course with a minimum of 50 percent devoted to Michigan history. The deadline for nominations is March 30. Send nominations to the Historical Society of Michigan, 2117 Wash-

tenaw Ave., Ann Arbor 48104. Include the nominee's name, school, school address and phone number and grade level as well as the name, address and daytime phone number of the nominator.

The Historical Society of Michigan is the only non-governmental, not-for-profit statewide historical organization working to preserve and interpret Michigan's heritage. It is supported by nearly 5,000 members and serves as the major clearinghouse of information for more than 275 local historical and preservation organizations in Michigan.

Medicine is focus at health-o-rama

Medicines are powerful weapons in the health care arsenal, but used improperly they can cause serious health problems.

A good way to prevent this is to ask a pharmacist for information about medicines.

To provide information, the Oakland County Health Division and the Oakland County Pharmacists Association will sponsor an "Ask the Pharmacist" exhibit at Project Health-O-Rama 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Wednesday, April 4, at the Mercy Center, 28600 11 Mile Road, Farmington Hills.

A pharmacist will be on hand to check medicines and screen for possible problems. Residents who have questions about prescription or patent medicines should bring a list of them.

The pharmacist also will provide advice on buying and using medicines.

The workshop will include talks by a series of guest experts in pure and applied physics, research into physics teaching and production of videotape materials for later use in the teacher's own class.

All high school physics teachers in southeast Michigan are eligible to apply for the Excellence in Physics Teaching program. The workshop is offered by the WSU physics department through the College of Lifelong Learning and is supported by the National Science Foundation. Dr. Patrick Kenely, associate professor of physics, is directing the project.


