Junior Women's Club marks anniversary

Farmington Hills Junior Women's Club is celebrating its 10th year of service to the Farmington community and, during the month of April, joins 20 Michigan Junior Women's Clubs to celebrate Junior Women's Club month.

The Farmington organization is affiliated with Michigan Federation of Women's Clubs and General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC), which is the oldest and largest non-denominational, non-partisan, international service organization of volunteer women in the world.

The Michigan State Federation of Junior Women's Clubs, with a membership of 500 statewide, is a community service organization working in their common interests of education, public interests, fine arts, child abuse and neglect, substance abuse and philanthropic activities.

Although the total membership may be small, the GFWC Michigan Junior Clubs this year reported 800 projects conducted and \$106,419 raised and donated to their various service projects within the 1983 club year.

The Farmington Hills Juniors have taken an active role in the statewide Junior project, Girlstown, which is a home for emotionally disturbed girls, funded in part by the Junior clubs.

The club has also been involved in projects relating to substance abuse. Through their major fund-raiser, the game "Opportunity Farmington," \$4,600 has been donated to the Farmington Area Advisory Council for educational materials to improve the community's education of the growing problems of substance abuse and drunk driving.

Club members have also participated in the newly established "Families in Action" organization which encourages parents to help their children find alternatives to activities involving the use of drugs and alcohol.

An additional \$1,000 from game sales has been donated to the two city libraries to develop special book collections on the substance abuse topic.

NFH musicians score in state festival

Instrumental music students from North Farmington High School scored high in the state Solo and Ensemble Festival in Howell, late last month. In 14 out of 17 events, the teens received a rating of I, the highest rating possible, and came in for a 2 rating in the other three.

The festivals are sponsored by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association, which now is in its 50th year of serving the musical needs of

the state's youth.

Seven performers from North received first division ratings on proficiency examinations, judged for solo, scales and sight reading. Proficiency ratings are given on three levels, I, II and III, with III being the most difficult.

Proficiency III winners were Philip Ross, an alto saxophone player and Barbara Greenley, a flute player.

Jon Greenberg passed the Proficiency II examination on trumpet.

Coming in winners in the Proficiency I category were John Didovic, clarinetist; Laurie McKinnon, a flute player; Autumn Dunbar and Ken Stein, both cellists.

Four ninth graders received I ratings for their solos; Gary Brode, Lisa Hart, Kim Walquist and Angie Chen.

THREE ENSEMBLES took I ratings.

Ross and Michael Kannisto scored for their alto saxophone duet.

Greenberg and Brode scored for their trumpet duet. And so did the flute trio made up of Alka Agrawal, Kim Larson and Lisa Bagdasarian.

Second division rating winners were Adrienne Dummer for a clarinet solo and Kim Trabbic for a flute solo. Another second division rating win was taken for the viola duet made up of Kim Walquist and Lisa Hart.

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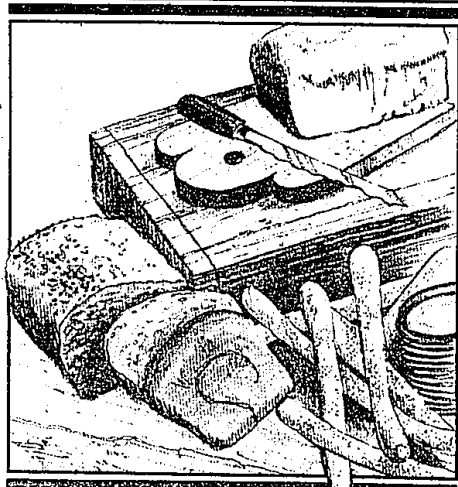
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
