

Dance Collective performs at OCC

Detroit Dance Collective will present a concert of new works at 8 p.m. Friday, May 11, in Wallace P. Smith Performing Arts Theatre, Orchard Ridge Campus, Oakland Community College. The collective is the modern dance company in residence at OCC's Royal Oak Campus where they rehearse, perform and teach non-credit courses in modern, ballet and jazz for children, teens and adults.

The collective, headed by artistic directors Barbara Selinger and Paula Kramer, has been touring the state with its concerts, lecture demonstrations and teaching residencies for dancers of all ages and all skill levels.

New dances made possible through Creative Artists Grants from the Michigan Council for the Arts and presented to Selinger and Kramer will be featured.

They include Selinger's "Bluegrass Jamboree," originally choreographed as a solo, and "E-Mist," a 30 minute piece inspired by images from Japanese pictorial scrolls. An original for this piece has been composed by Walter Szymanski, Detroit musician and faculty member at Oakland University. Selinger will also present "Equinox," a quartet danced to an hypnotic score by Frank Becker and "Insidout," a solo created especially for her by Bill Evans, choreographer, teacher and performer who is the director of the Winnipeg Contemporary Dance Company.

ALSO FEATURED is "Travellers On The Same Road," a holocaust piece based on paintings by Pablo Picasso and Ernst Barlach's sculpture, "The Avenger."

Dancing with the company are guest artists Deborah Luke, Detroit City Dance Company, Michael McNeil, Wayne State University Dance Company, Jane Slattery, on the faculty at Oakland University and Matthew Turnbull, Harbinger Dance Company. Company members Anita Surma

Rockstael, Marina Cantarella, Mary Auty Dziuba, Connie Alken Moore and Selinger will all dance featured roles in the concert.

Tickets for the performance are \$4 in advance at the box office or \$5 at the door. Group rates are available and may be arranged by calling 471-7790.
