CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on April 2, 1984, by Mayor Yoder in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.
PRESENT: Mayor Yoder, Councilmen Bennett, Hartcock, Tupper, Walker.
OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deaman, Director Billing, Director Selfert, City Clerk Busby.
Minutes of previous meeting were approved.
Council held a Public Hearing to review the project plan and issuance of Economic Development Corporation bonds for the Farmington/Nine Mile Side Associates project. Council adopted a resolution approving the project plan as submitted by the Farmington Economic Development Corporation.
Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council accepted, with regret, the resignation of William Conroy from the Cable Access Committee.
Council approved the Annual Tent Sale for March Tire Company, April 23-26, 1984.
Council instructed that the Area Agency on Aging be contacted concerning whether or not certain presently funded activities are in jeopardy.
Council instructed that their concern be expressed to State and Federal legislators over the use of public funds to correct problems resulting from the insulation of homes with Urea Formaldehyde.

Ordinance C-515-84, which would amend Chapters 1 and 5, Traffic Control Ordinances re: Stop Streets and Prohibited Parking on certain streets.
Ordinance C-514-84, which would adopt the 1984 Edition of the BOCA Basic Fire Prevention Code with modifications.
Council was informed of the City Manager's Public Hearing on April 9, 1984, on the proposed use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.
Council was advised that Perry Drug Store, Inc. has requested an SDM License for their new location at the proposed Crossroads shopping center.
Jeanette Liming was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Conroy on the Cable Access Committee, and James Mitchell was reappointed to the Committee for a three-year term.
Council received the General Fund and the 47th District Court Financial Reports for the eight months ended February 29, 1984.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Mayor Pro Tem Dolan opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council at 7:30 P.M. on April 9, 1984. Members present: Alkatheh, Amador, Dolan, Duffley, Sorensen and Wolf. Absent: Williams. Others present: City Clerk Cairns, Assistant City Manager Conk and City Attorney Libbert.
Minutes of February 27, 1984 were approved as presented and minutes of March 13 and 18, 1984 were approved as corrected.
The date for hearing requests for the remaining liquor license was referred to staff for recommendations of a specific date.
Council approved the transfer of employment of Key International Manufacturing Inc. (A-Line Plastic Division), from the City of Farmington Hills to the Charter Township of Plymouth.
Council approved the application of Finnish Center to hold Ethnic Festival from May 23 through May 27, 1984.
Council approved selling city water to Middle Hones Park in City of Novi.
Request of Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan to hold "Homearama" in Farmington Hills August 29, 1984 was referred to staff for further information.
Ordinance to amend the City Building Code was referred to Staff for recommendations regarding emergency lighting and fire alarm systems.

An Environmental Review Record regarding the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County, which documents the environmental review of the project. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination, and copies, upon request.

The City of Farmington Hills will undertake to project development under the Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Farmington Hills is certifying to HUD that Farmington Hills and Lawrence C. Savage, in his official capacity as City Manager, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental review, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, Farmington Hills may use the Block Grant funds, and HUD will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval of the release of funds and acceptance of the certification only if it is one of the following: (a) that the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer of substantial authority by HUD or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project includes omission of a required document, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environmental review process. Objections must be presented and addressed to HUD within the required period (48 CFR Part 54) and may be addressed to HUD, P.O. Box 100, Detroit, Michigan 48266. Any objection must be received by HUD no later than May 6, 1984 will be considered by HUD. No objection received after May 6, 1984 will be considered by HUD.
