They seek out drunks

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Some drunks speed, some slow down to a snail's pace, he said.

Around midnight, Pearson stopped a motorist clocked by radar doing 61 miles an hour on 10 Mile. The man got out of the car and gave some indication that he'd been drinking.

After putting him through preliminary physical tests like walking a straight line and mental tests like reciting the alphabet, Pearson asked him to take the preliminary breath test.

The man's breath registered .08 — not high enough for an arrest. Pearson gave him a speeding ticket and the motorist was on his way.

Soon after, Pearson drove for a while behind a car moving very slowly and apparently having difficulty staying in a traffic lane. Pearson put on the flashing lights, and made the stop. When he went to talk with the driver, he discovered an elderly man from Novi who was sober but didn't know where he was going.

spotted a car moving slowly north on Telegraph about 10 Mile. He followed and observed. The driver turned, very slowly into a restaurant parking lot and was having difficulty bringing the car to a full stop.

Pearson switched on his lights, and when the car stopped, he identified himself. Inside were two young men.

The car smelled of alcohol. And the driver, who said he was a college student, insisted he had one beer at a friend's house.

But the preliminary exercises led Pearson to suspect he had had more than that to drink. The student blew .117 and .121 on two preliminary breath tests.

At that point, Pearson added the 29th to his string of drunk driver arrests.

The man was informed of his rights, handcuffed and requested to take the Breathalyzer test. He agreed and the county car with the Breathalyzer was called to the scene. The motorist registered .11 and .10, just on the borderline.

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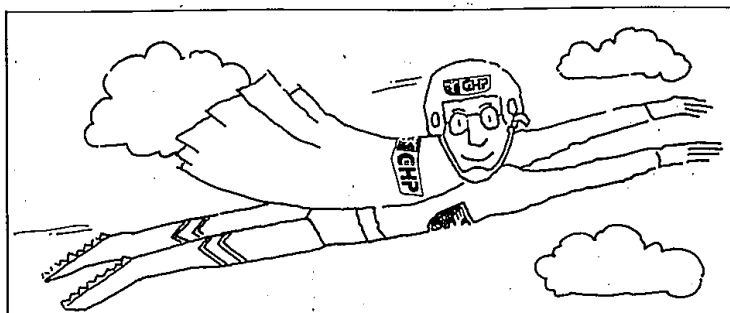
