## Tips for choosing best rental car deal

AST WEEK I told you about my experience while renting a car in Europe, where I did everything wrong. This week I would like to tell you how to do it right. I would also like to talk about alternative ways of getting around when you

live ways of getting around when you travel by land.

In Michigan we are so car-oriented that we often don't think about the many other methods of land transpor-tation. A creative traveler occasions everything taking a train to Toronto, controlling the land of the land of the controlling properties of the land of travel across a dewnlown area. Of tourse there are times when the only logical way to travel is by car, and the only logical decision is to rent a car. I asked Denice Yarber of Livonia, a supervisor in the World Travel de-partment of the American Automobile Association, to give me her expert ad-vice on rending a car.

SHE HAS rented cars several times herself, and has helped hundreds of AAA members to rent the cars that suited their needs. She suggests that

AAA members to reint the cars that suited their needs. She suggests that you start at AAA, or your travel agent, where you can check the brochures of major car rental companies for any special rate program applicable during your travel time.

If you reserve your rental car before you leave home, you are guaranteed the rate if the rental company must give you a more expensive car, automatic transmission is usually found only on a large, expensive car; even on a smaller car it costs more, so choose a stick shift to save money.

Before you choose a car, compare all costs: the per-day restal, the per-day versus the per-week rental; per-mile costs versus unlimited mileage, when its available, the cost of gasoline; insurance, drop-off charges; taxes.



ranging from a low of four percent in Spain to a high of 33.3 percent in France. Ask about their gasoline poli-cy; some companies will charge you to fill up before you leave and after you return the car.

ALL CARS come with basic insurance. Check to see if your car insurance covers a collision outside Michigan. Chances are it will cover it in the United States or Canada but not over-

Unlited States or Canada but not over-seas.

Denice suggests that you consider a Collision Damage Walver (CDW) if you want collision insurance but you don't want to pay a large deductible, which can raage from five dollars to \$1,500. CDW costs about five dollars extra a day. If your health insurance covers medical costs away from home you may not want to buy Personal Accident Insurance.

tobacco, ballet performances and other events.


