She is a foy, and she is tops in those numbers where she can draw on her comedic talent Gall Bedlighted in Yout Occar, and You Cornany and You Cornany also interacts well with Robert Spencer. They portray a martied couple and sing 'We're Gona Be All Right' from 'Do Hear a Walts' This number is one of the best.
