CHILD BIRTH EDUCATION CLASSES — A six-week program to prepare expectant parents to participate fully in their birth will be held at East Middle School, beginning May 3 on Thursdays 7:30-9:30 p.m. Classes will extensively cover pregnancy, birth, birthing options and labor-support techniques. INSTRUCTIONAL SPORTS CAMP — Instructional Sports Camps will be offered this summer by Farmington Hills Parks & Recreation and Oakland

Community College. The camps will be held during the summer of 1984 at the Orchard Ridge Campus in Farmington Hills. The purpose of the Instructional Sports Camps will be to provide a personal approach to the development of skills and techniques particular to each sport. Camp enrollment will be geared to a small student to instructor ratio, and will be available for both boys and girls of middle-school age and above. Each individual will receive instruction in a natural progression suited to their needs. Attention will be paid to all aspects of each activity. The camps

will be offered on a one-week basis, meeting Monday-Friday for a total of 17.5 instructional hours per week at a cost of \$45 per camp, beginning the week of June 11. year. A similar pattern is apparent in residential burglaries with a drop from 97 non-forcible entries in 1982 to 54 in 1983. But forced entries increased to 451 last year from 347 in 1982.

Also listed in Part I crimes are decreases in forcible rape, down to six last year from seven in 1982. Arson also dropped from 39 incidents in 1982 to 21 last year.

In Part II crimes, vandalism and vagrancy saw the greatest increase. Incidents of vandalism increased from 791 in 1982 to 887 in 1983. Vagrancy

jumped from 105 in 1982 to 187 last year.

The total increase in Part II crimes, which also includes fraud, disorderly conduct, sex offenses (indecent exposures, for example) and liquor violations, is 12 percent. That's an increase of 140 crimes.

Notable decreases were seen in the number of narcotics incidents, dropping to 31 last year compared to 52 in 1982. Incidents of family and child abuse, neglect and other offenses such as non-payment of alimony dropped from 28 in 1982 to 16 last year.

In an accompanying arrest summary, Farmington Hills police indicate that in 1983, a total of 1,672 arrests were made. Those are "actual bodies brought in here," DeSilvio said.

In breaking down the totals, police arrested 365 individuals for Part I crimes, 766 for Part II crimes and 541 for Part III complaints (warrants, ju-

venile complaints and traffic vehicle complaints).

The number of arrests made, however, doesn't imply a clearance rate for offenses committed in 1983, DeSilvio said. For example, a person arrested for burglary could have been charged with several of the total number of burglaries that occurred, she said.

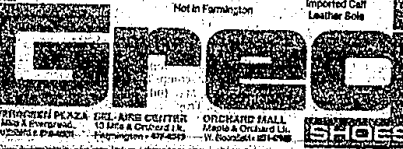
