

# Raiders move closer to NSL crown

North Farmington is methodically marching toward a Northwest Suburban League boys track title. The Raiders won their third straight NSL dual meet Thursday, destroying Redford Thurston 101-38. The Raiders are 3-1 overall, 3-0 in the league. Brian Hood led the Raiders' assault winning three events and anchoring the winning 400-meter relay team. Hood won the shot put, tossing 43-14. His 121-4 throw won the discus and his 12:02 time won the 100-meter dash. Hood teamed with Chris Wojtowicz, Tom Doerr and Victor Shaw to win the 400-meter relay in 47.8. Distance man Kirk Armstrong, an All-Area cross country performer last

fall, won the 1,600-meter run (4:49.0) and the 3,200-meter run (10:34.0). Armstrong, a sophomore, also anchored the winning 3,200-meter relay team, teaming with Ken Welke, Rocky Nill and Mike Elmdon on a 9:38.0. Other individual winners for North were: Shaw in the long jump (19-3), Chris Weir tied for first in the pole vault with Thurston's David Thomas (10-0), Kevin Kopko in the 110-meter hurdles (17:04), Doerr in the 200-meter dash (24.87), and Welke in the 800-meter run (2:08.9). Welke anchored the winning 1,600-meter relay, teaming with Kopko, Craig Ragland, and Pete Humanc on a 3:45.9. Shaw anchored the winning 800-

meter relay, joining David Kramer, Doerr, and Mickey Ruel in a 1:39.8. FARMINGTON HARRISON lost to Walled Lake Western Thursday, 78-59, despite two outstanding performances. Mike Rosenau won both individual sprint events, taking the 100-meter dash in 11.38 and the 200-meter dash in 24.1. He also anchored the winning 800-meter run, teaming with Don Sweney, Bill Wood, and Eric Gayer on a 3:38.8. Hurdler Jerry Holcomb also had a big day. He won the 110-meter hurdles in 16:53 and the 300-meter hurdles in 42.2. "We were ahead for the first nine events," said Harrison coach John

Schumacher. "They took the lead going into the 11th. They just had more depth." The Hawks took three of the five field events. Dave Younger won the high jump (6-1), Paul Riglio took the discus (128-8) and John Sepelys won the long jump (19-4). Greg Bissell won the 400-meter run in 52.7. The Hawks team of Don Lacey, Mike

Ekke, Dave Elm and Bissell won the 300-meter relay in 8:50.0. The Hawks' record falls to 1-2. FARMINGTON, Observerland's No. 2-ranked team, won all but two events against Walled Lake Central in a 107-30 rout Thursday. Ab Hazen and Greg Feenstra each won a pair of events for the Falcons. Hazen won the high jump (6-0) and the discus (128-8), while Feenstra took the long jump (18-10 1/4) and the 300-meter hurdles (41.6). The Falcons are now 4-0 on the season.

Craig Petersmark in the shot put (43-3), Tim Berry in the 110-meter hurdles (16:16), Nate Case in the 100-meter dash (11.8), Brian Loozer in the 200-meter dash (23.69), Dan Imus in the 400-meter dash (54.09), freshman Al Sieblich in the 800-meter run (2:38.0), Bruce Kratt in the 1,600-meter run (4:44.6) and Dave Dunneback in the 3,200-meter run (10:25.9). Farmington also won the 400-meter relay (47.0), the 800-meter relay (3:37.0) and the 1,600-meter relay (3:47.0). The Falcons are now 4-0 on the season.

# No. 1-ranked Falcons unbeaten

Farmington, Observerland's No. 1-ranked girls track team, continued its domination Thursday with a 90-38 rout of Walled Lake Central. It was the Falcons' fourth straight win this season. Terri Quenneville got the Falcons started by setting a school shot put record. Her first-place toss of 33-6 eclipsed the old mark set in 1979 by Cheryl Lacy. "This was a record she has been working for for three years," said a jubilant Farmington coach Greg Young. Quenneville also took first in the discus with a 107-3. The Falcons captured three of four firsts in the field events as Tracy Hule won the long jump with a 14-9. Hule also won the 100-yard dash in 12.4. Rhonda Lancaster won both hurdle events — the 100-yard highs (no time available) and the 330-yard lows (49.3). Other individual winners for the Falcons were: Laura Spence in the 440-yard dash (1:06.5), Kim Steiner in the 880-yard run (2:40.0), and Jenny Lindbert in the 2-mile run (12:15.8). The Falcons took all four relays: The 440-yard team of Hule, Lancaster, Karen Ruoyan and Jennifer Hadley went 54.5; the 880-yard team of Ruoyan, Spence, Lori Casaroli and Laura Delagies went 1:56.7; the mile team of Steiner, Kim Schwanke, Spence, and Jill Anderson went 4:43.3; and the 2-mile team of Steiner, Anna Quenneville, Lindbert and Carrie Hale went 11:08.9.

Manderfield won the shot put (30-9) and the discus (93-2). Thurston took the high jump (4-6) and the 110-meter hurdles (18-8). Shaw, an ultra-talented sophomore who will be moving out of state next year, won the long jump (15-3 1/4) and the 100-meter dash (13.9). "The girls performed well," said North assistant coach Greg Grodzicki. "But, we just had total dominance in numbers (depth)." Other first-place finishers for the Raiders were: Laurie Wright in the 300-meter hurdles (53.3), and Beth Emery in the 800-meter run (2:38.7). North also took three of the four relay events: The 400-meter team of Audrey Niskar, Diane Richel, Lisa Rudin and Wendy Love went 56.1; the 1,600-meter team of Emery, Erin O'Leary, Terry Spengler and Jill Shuler went 4:35.0; and the 3,200-meter team of Kathy Koteras, Nancy Cotran, Mary Gooding and Emery went 11:33.1.

FARMINGTON HARRISON, ranked No. 5 in Observerland, lost its first meet of the season, 71-57, to Walled Lake Western despite another outstanding performance by Lauri Runk.

Runk won four individual events and broke her own school record in the long jump. Her winning leap was 17-1 1/4, bettering her old mark of 16-5 set last season. Runk also won the high jump (5-2), the mile run (8:04.4) and the 2-mile run (18:13.0). Jamie Holcomb won the 110-yard hurdles with a 16.6. Tracy Brod won the 440-yard dash in 1:05.8 and Jenny Anderson won the 880-yard run with a 2:46.5. But, the Hawks could capture just one relay — the 3-mile — which cost them dearly. The 2-mile team of Andrea Pascoe, Andrea Breuhan, Anderson and Brod won in 11:05.0. "This was a very big meet for us," said Hawk coach Mark Babcock. "It was very close to the end. Walled Lake has a pretty tough team, but this is a disappointing loss, to say the least."
